



Speech & Debate Tournament

The Jakarta International College chapter of Pi Kappa Delta, the 110-year-old Speech and Debate Honors Society, is hosting a Speech and Debate Tournament in Jakarta, Indonesia, on Saturday, December 11th, 2021. This year, it will be held online. There are categories for Junior High School, High School, and University speech and debate competitors with a total prize of Rp. 15,000,000 (over \$1,000). You can register online via a form, or send this completed form (see the last pages) via email.

Representatives from US Speech and Debate and/or Pi Kappa Delta will be present in the online tournament. They will help officiate the tournament, as well as provide information for competitors regarding Speech and Debate in the United States.

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
Speech and Debate Categories:

- **Junior World Schools Debate:** This is open to teams of 3+ students between the ages of 12 and 14, or in grades 7-9. Please see the World Schools Debate information on pages 4-7.
- **Senior World Schools Debate:** This is open to teams of 3+ students between the ages of 15 and 17, or in grades 10-12. Please see the World Schools Debate information on pages 4-7.
- **Pi Kappa Delta Honors World Schools Debate:** This is open to teams of 3+ students who are enrolled in a College or University, or are otherwise at or above the age of 16. Please see the World Schools Debate information on pages 4-7.
- **Pi Kappa Delta Honors Original Spoken Word Poetry:** This individual speech event is open to any entrant at or above the age of 16. This shall be in the form of original spoken word poetry (recitation of poem originally composed by the entrant), and will be judged based upon speaking quality, performance, vocalization, and originality. Poems are typically approximately 5 minutes. Please see the Original Spoken Word Poetry information on pages 8-9.
- **Pi Kappa Delta Honors Original Oratory:** This individual speech event is open to any entrant at or above the age of 16. This shall be in the form of an original speech composed and delivered by the entrant, and will be judged based upon speaking quality, importance, relatability, and originality. Speeches are typically approximately 10 minutes. Please see the Original Oratory information on pages 10-11.

Tournament categories may be consolidated or are subject to change with reasonable notice.

Participating School Judges: Each team, club, and/or school must offer at least 1 judge per 6 students to assist in judging various events. Coaches, advisors, JIC or School alumni (arranged by JIC for their placement) or adult students may serve as judges. Judges must speak English fluently. Judges will be given training and a rubric to follow to make judging easy. Conflicts of interest are to be avoided in judge placement. Judges should contact JIC with their information and willingness to judge. Judge training will take approximately 1 hour at home and will be emailed in the days prior to the tournament.

World Schools Debate



"World Schools Debate" is the name that United States debate organizations use to refer to the style of debate popular in Australia, Singapore, Indonesia, Malaysia, and elsewhere around the world. Indonesians are probably familiar with this style of debate.

It is a dynamic format combining "prepared" topics with "impromptu" topics, encouraging debaters to focus on specific issues rather than debate theory or procedural arguments. This highly interactive style of debate allows debaters to engage each other, even during speeches. This challenging format requires good teamwork and in-depth quality argumentation.

There are three debaters per team, but typically there is a fourth member of each team that assists with preparation, and can substitute in the case of illness, etc.

In our JIC debate, each team will be assigned either "Proposition" or "Opposition" an hour before the debate begins. The "Proposition" supports the "Motion", and the "Opposition" opposes the "Motion". So, teams are required to prepare both the "Proposition" and "Opposition" sides of the debate, and will not be told until one hour prior to the debate which side of the debate they are assigned. Final rounds will use completely impromptu debate motions that will be given an hour before the debate begins.

The Main Round Debate Motion is given here:

"This house would mandate the use of Bahasa Indonesia as a medium of instruction in all schools and universities in Indonesia."

Teams are to prepare for both the "Proposition" and "Opposition" sides of the debate, and be prepared to win from either side. A high level of preparation is expected for the Main Round.

If Teams are selected to advance to the Final Round(s), they will be given new impromptu motions, and be given one hour to prepare.

World Schools Debate Format:

In World Schools Debate, each of the three debaters will give an 8 minute (maximum) speech during the debate. Debaters may take "Points of Information" (POIs) from the opposing side (these are optional), or may give POIs to the opposing side. Interruptions are forbidden, but debaters may raise their hand and offer POIs, which may be accepted or refused by the speaker. The general format of the debate is as follows:

Speech	Time	Responsibility of Debater
1st Proposition	8 min	Introduce motion, define key terms, set burdens, establish mechanism or model if needed, offer substantive arguments
1st Opposition	8 min	Deal with proposed framework by proposition, clash with proposition arguments, offer own substantive arguments
2nd Proposition	8 min	Clash, offer new substantive arguments, defend 1st speaker's points
2nd Opposition	8 min	Clash, offer new substantive arguments, defend 1st speaker's points
3rd Proposition	8 min	Clash and Summarize Key Issues
3rd Opposition	8 min	Clash and Summarize Key Issues
Opposition Reply	4 min	Crystallize the round
Proposition Reply	4 min	Crystallize the round

World Schools Debate Judging:

In World Schools Debate (WSD), the winning team is the team with the most points. The score for each speech is based on a combination of style, content, and strategy.

Style is 40% of the total score. Speakers should communicate clearly using effective rate, pitch, tone, hand gestures, facial expressions, etc. The use of notes should not be penalized unless it hinders delivery; however, speakers should not read their speeches. Notes are to be used only for reference.

Content is 40% of the total score. This portion of the score should focus on the argumentation used by the speaker, divorced from the style. Weak arguments should be marked accordingly, even if the other team does not expose a weak argument. Judges should not be influenced by their own personal beliefs or specialized knowledge when making this decision.

Strategy is 20% of the total score. Strategy consists of whether or not the speaker understands the importance of the issues in the debate and the structure/timing of the speech. Debaters should identify the most substantive issues and allocate their time to covering issues based on the relative importance. Strategy may also consider answers to points of information and choosing when/how to address them. Strategy is not content: a speaker who answers the critical issues with weak responses should get poor marks for content but good marks for strategy.

Original Oratory

This is an original, memorized, persuasive speech, composed and delivered by the entrant. It is a well researched and organized presentation about a topic with evidence, logic, emotional appeals, and sometimes humor to convey a message. Oratory gives students the unique opportunity to showcase their voice and passion for their topic. Topics may be of a value orientation and affect people at a personal level, or they can be more of a policy orientation and ask an audience to enact particular policies or solve societal problems. Any topic is allowed.

Rules and Requirements:

- Your piece must be your original work.
- It will be judged based upon speaking quality, importance, relatability, and originality.
- The delivery must be memorized, and no book or script may be used.
- The speech may be a maximum of 10 minutes (with a 30 second grace period).

Writing the Speech:

- Grab your listener's attention. Link this to your speech. Explain the background to your topic. Why should we care? Cite to an authority. State a precise, concise thesis - what is your position? Preview your speech; provide a roadmap.
- Explain the problem. Support your claims with facts (cite experts) and anecdotes. Use humor if possible. Try to connect with your audience. Drive your point home. Explain how the problem negatively impacts society. Support your claims. Provide solutions. Be reasonable, be realistic, be inspirational.
- Review what you told the audience. Talk heart to heart - inspire your audience. Use a creative clincher - go full circle and connect back to the beginning of your speech.

Original Spoken Word Poetry

Original Spoken Word Poetry is poetry written for performance to express ideas, experience, or emotion through the creative arrangement of words according to their sound, their rhythm, and their meaning.

Rules and Requirements:

- Your piece must be your original work. You must bring a written copy; it must follow MLA style guidelines, including a “works-cited” page. Judges may disqualify a presenter for plagiarism; all scoring is based upon the spoken performance.
- No more than 150 words of the original poetry may be direct quotation.
- The delivery must be memorized, and no book or script may be used.
- Your presentation cannot go over 5 minutes long (with a 30 second grace period).

Writing the Poem:

- Decide on a topic. Good taste is the only limit. A successful performer will craft a piece that elicits critical thought, reflection, or emotion.
- Poetry may be rhymed, free, or blank verse.
- Develop the manuscript. Keep in mind the audience will hear but not see the sentences. Read aloud what is written to see if it flows well and that it meets the time requirements. As you polish the spoken word poem, have other people listen and suggest improvements. Revise and rewrite as necessary. Practice the Delivery.
- When the spoken word poem is memorized, practice and record yourself. Use gestures and facial expression, but don’t over-rehearse. A good delivery should be polished, direct, clearly enunciated, easily heard, and visually interesting to watch.
