World Schools Debate

The Main Round Debate Motion is:

"This house would mandate the use of Bahasa Indonesia as a medium of instruction in all schools and universities in Indonesia."

Each team will be assigned either "Proposition" or "Opposition" an hour before the debate begins. The "Proposition" supports the "Motion", and the "Opposition" opposes the "Motion". So, teams are required to prepare both the "Proposition" and "Opposition" sides of the debate, and will not be told until one hour prior to the debate which side of the debate they are assigned.

Semi-Final and Final rounds will use completely impromptu debate motions that will be given an hour before the debate begins.

World Schools Debate Judging:

In World Schools Debate (WSD), the winning team is the team with the most points. The score for each speech is based on a combination of style, content, and strategy.

Style is 40% of the total score. Speakers should communicate clearly using effective rate, pitch, tone, hand gestures, facial expressions, etc. The use of notes should not be penalized unless it hinders delivery; however, speakers should not read their speeches. Notes are to be used only for reference.

Content is 40% of the total score. This portion of the score should focus on the argumentation used by the speaker, divorced from the style. Weak arguments should be marked accordingly, even if the other team does not expose a weak argument. Judges should not be influenced by their own personal beliefs or specialized knowledge when making this decision.

Strategy is 20% of the total score. Strategy consists of whether or not the speaker understands the importance of the issues in the debate and the structure/timing of the speech. Debaters should identify the most substantive issues and allocate their time to covering issues based on the relative importance. Strategy may also consider answers to points of information and choosing when/how to address them. Strategy is not content: a speaker who answers the critical issues with weak responses should get poor marks for content but good marks for strategy.

Tournament Flow:

1. The Main round

Junior World School Debate: Will be divided into 3 zoom rooms with 2 teams competing in each room.

Senior World School Debate: Will be divided into 5 zoom rooms with 2 teams competing in each room. Due to the odd number of participating team, 1 team will be selected by random to directly advance to the semi-final round.

2. Second round

Finals for Junior World School Debate: Total of 4 teams will be competing in this round. The top 2 scorers will win the 1st and runner up winner.

Semi-finals for Senior World School Debate: Total of 6 teams will be competing in this round. Only 2 of the highest scorers will be selected to compete in the finals.

3. Third round

This is final round for **senior category**. 2 top teams will be competing in the main room for the first place.

The Original Oratory is open for any topic of the speaker's choosing. Participants are required to prepare 1 speech only, which will be presented for both the main round and finals.

Rules and Requirements:

- Your piece must be your original work.
- It will be judged based upon speaking quality, importance, relatability, and originality.
- The delivery must be memorized, and no book or script may be used.
- The speech may be a maximum of 10 minutes (with a 30 second grace period).

Tournament Flow:

1. The Main round

All Participant will be competing in the same zoom breakout rooms. There will be 2 judges evaluating your performances. (10 mins max. for each speaker)

2. Final round

Top 2 speakers will be selected and recite their speech once more in the final round, competing for the first place evaluated by 3 judges.

The Original Spoken Poetry is open for any topic of the participant's choosing. Participants are required to prepare 1 poem only, which will be presented for both the main round and finals.

Rules and Requirements:

- Your piece must be your original work. You must bring a written copy; it must follow MLA style guidelines, including a "works-cited" page. Judges may disqualify a presenter for plagiarism; all scoring is based upon the spoken performance.
- No more than 150 words of the original poetry may be direct quotation.
- The delivery must be memorized, and no book or script may be used.
- Your presentation cannot go over 5 minutes long (with a 30 second grace period).
